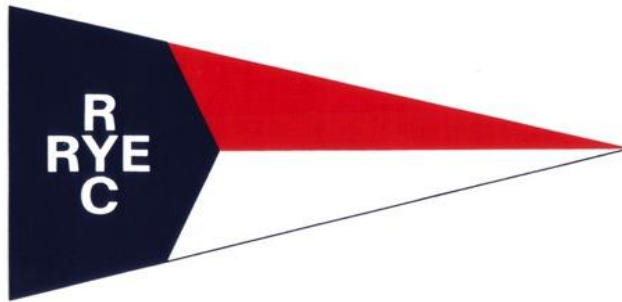

Sailing

In preparation for the upcoming season, the Sailing Committee and volunteers are starting to dust things off and check things in preparation.

Apart from a few missing things, the need for a good wash (weather permitting) and general service and maintenance, the rescue boats and equipment are in good condition after a lot of effort was spent on them last year.

Racks have been nearly completed in the yard so we can maximise our boat storage and the drainage has been improved and grass planted and mowed, so the yard is starting to look good. Unfortunately, the large amount of boats in the yard has hampered this somewhat, so as a consequence a number that have not been used for some time will be evicted from the yard and there is a proposal to introduce a winter storage fee for boats that don't get removed by season end.

The Vice Commodore has drawn up a yard storage plan to further maximise the yard usage and we intend to install additional hoses on reels so that the washing of boats does not cause choke points at the gate as it has in previous seasons.

If anyone has some lengths of vinylite (the tubular matting on the deck of Westerly) and is happy to donate it to the club it would be appreciated, as the change room floors and rubber ducky decks could really do with some. It is about \$60 per metre at Clark rubber, so we're trying to avoid that expense if possible.

Sailing Programs and Notice of Race are currently being finalised, so all should be in preparation for the mid October season start. See you all soon.

RYC Junior Community Award

This award was presented at the AGM. The purpose of the award is to recognise a Junior member's outstanding contribution to our club through:

- their involvement and participation in the club community
- their leadership abilities and impact as a positive role model
- their personal conduct throughout the year

One of the rewarding things about being a parent at the club over the past 8-9 years has been seeing some of our tiny tackers develop into competent and confident young sailors.

We hope that this award encourages our Junior members to also think about their own development as responsible, contributing members of our club. And in particular, the individual, valuable things they have to offer – the parts that they especially - are able to play in the broader club community by stepping up, pitching in and learning the ropes alongside our adult members.

This award is open to any paid-up Junior member aged 18 or under at the time of the AGM. Each year, the recipient will receive this trophy – as well as a certificate and a \$200 voucher to Sport Phillip Marine.

The recipient of the inaugural award was unanimously decided by the Executive Committee to be given to Ben Brunton, for his exemplary personal conduct, positive attitude and quiet leadership.

Over the course of the season, he has consistently helped out, assisting other members with yard works, gate and fence construction and general maintenance. He has also volunteered to fill in on the rescue boat, when the rostered crew haven't arrive and he can regularly be spotted helping other members to drag their boats up the beach.

His conduct over the season demonstrates teamwork, mateship, community spirit and respect for others – in other words, the kinds of fundamental principles that bring people together and underpin our club's philosophy as a friendly, supportive and welcoming place to be for people of all ages.

New **Racing Rules** will apply for the coming Sailing Season:

RACING RULES of SAILING:

World Sailing have now published the updated Racing Rules of Sailing to apply for 2017 to 2020. These rules will now apply for our Club Racing (and all other Sailing events) for the coming season. Australian Sailing have the new "Blue Book", the Racing Rules including the Prescriptions of Australian Sailing, available on their website as an ebook.

Changes to the Rules:

Some of these are:

- **Definitions:** The term *conflict of interest* has been added to definitions. This is in the context of Protest Hearings.
- **Definitions:** The term *support person* is included in definitions – these persons are now subject to Misconduct – Section C of the RRS under RRS 69, 70 and 71. This gives an organising authority the option of taking action to deal with misconduct of parents, coaches or other support persons who are not actually taking part in sailing activities. In some circumstances the outcome can impact on the race or series score of race participants.
- **Fundamental Rules:** RRS 3 *Acceptance of the Rules* outlines the obligations of competitors and all support persons to abide by the rules which they agree to accept by taking part in any sailing event.
 - **RRS 5** *Anti-doping rule* has been added
 - **RRS 6** *Betting and anti-corruption rule* has been added
 - **RRS 7** *Disciplinary Code* has been added
- Rules of Part 2 When Boats Meet and Part 3 General Limitations **HAVE NOT CHANGED**
- Section C At Marks and Obstructions –
 - RRS 18.2 (d) has been added to clarify obligations of giving room at marks

- RRS 20.1 Hailing for room at an obstruction has been changed significantly for greater clarity
- Under Conduct of a Race RRS 30.3 has been added to provide for Flag U as being an optional Warning signal – its use is similar to but a little different from Black Flag – *read carefully to understand*
- **Part 5 Protests** etc RRS 63.4 *Conflict of Interest* replaces the previous rule “interested party”
 - **RRS 64.4** is a new rule to deal with Decisions Concerning Support Persons
- **Section C Misconduct:**
 - **RRS 69** has had more specific detail added especially to 69.2 Action by a Protest Committee *WORLD SAILING have also issued a separate 60 page document on MISCONDUCT that more fully outlines examples of misconduct, what action to take and the steps to follow.*

I understand that the only way to get an Australian Sailing RRS 2017-2020 Blue Book is to download it from the Australian Sailing website under Sailing Services/Racing Rules/Racing Rules of Sailing. If you want to understand the Rules better – download a copy for yourself.

Rye YC NOTICE of RACE:

The Notice of Race (NoR) is now set out according to a template in the Racing Rules (Appendix K) and as such, they need to be updated to reflect the new template. There have been a number of changes, most of them wording where in effect the Rule is the much the same. However:

- The only significant change for Trailable Yachts under Category 6 of the Australian Sailing Safety Regulations Part 1 is to *delete* the need to carry a distress sheet (V sheet).
- Under Australian Sailing Safety Regulations Part 2 for OTB boats:
 - Identification lettering on boats no longer requires *class of boat*.
 - A *bailer is mandatory* on all boats that are not ‘self-draining’.
 - Shackle Key, paddle and towline are now *recommended equipment*
 - It is recommended that for all *Junior Class boats* that the towline is *attached ready for use*.
 - It is also recommended that all *Junior sailors under the age of 12 wear a PFD 1*.
- Under NoR 11 “Penalties” RRS 44.1 and 44.2 apply for Trailable Yachts and OTB monohulls, but *for Division C catamarans*, RRS 44.1 is changed so all *required on water penalties are One-Turn only*.
- Under NoR the third party liability insurance minimum cover has been changed to \$10 million as this is now the minimum amount in policy cover.

Rye YC SAILING INSTRUCTIONS:

The Sailing Instructions (SI) are now set out according to a template in the Racing Rules (Appendix L) and as such, they need to be updated to reflect the new template. There have been more changes to the Sailing Instructions and the most significant are:

- SI 1 Rules – Our SI specify both an operable motor in place ready to use and a VHF radio as additional equipment to the Category 6 specifications. We list the reference to flares as these are required by Maritime Safety Victoria Boating Regulations.
- Tow rings are no longer *required* for all monohulls but are recommended by the Sailing Committee for sailors new to the sport as an aid to towing.
- SI 10 Lists a number of fixed obstructions around the course area
- SI 11 The reference to a minimum of 4 knots has been deleted. The Start boat will now fly an “orange flag” while on station at the start.
- SI 12 we have included a reference to RRS 33 to change a mark of the course and signal the change to competitors should we need to.
- SI 13 we have highlighted the need to fly a blue flag on the committee boat while on station at the finish.

- SI 14 penalties, as noted in the NoR changes Division C will have a change to RRS 44.1 to make all penalties one-turn only.
- SI 15 sets out target times for days when there are 2 races (35 to 45 min each race) and 3 races (25 to 35 min each race).

CHANGE OF PROCEDURE FOR SHORTENING ANY COURSE

There is no longer any reference to shortening course in either the Notice of Race or the Sailing Instructions. The procedure is to simply follow RRS 32.2. The procedure will be to shorten at any rounding mark by placing the finish boat flying an S Flag next to the mark (2 sound signals) and this becomes the finish line. (It is possible to also shorten at any line a course requires boats to cross or at a gate)

While most of the other changes not listed here are changes of wording, the essence of the rule is the same. However members are still urged to read the new Club Notice of Race and Club Sailing Instructions so they are familiar with how our races will be managed. If you need further clarification of the changes, please ask a member of Sailing Committee.

Sailing school report

Hi everybody, I hope you are all well and managing to pass winter relatively comfortably. For this Sandbar I want to focus on a few dates for things starting early in the season and that means less than a month away!

Power Boat Courses:

I have scheduled 2 power boat courses for early in the season.

- On **Saturday 9th September** and **Sunday 10th September** I propose to run an Australian Sailing Powerboat Handling Course. Times will be **9:00 to 5:00** on both days. This course is primarily for members who either have not already got a Powerboat Licence or have a Licence but have not had much experience in driving Powerboats. It will cover all the information needed to sit the VicRoads test for a Powerboat licence as well as a day on the water to practice a series of boat driving skills both at low speed and higher speed. The cost of the course will be \$100 and enrolment forms will be on the website shortly.
- On **Saturday 7th October** and **Sunday 8th October** I propose to run an Australian Sailing Safety Boat Operator Course. Times will be **12:00 to 5:00** on Saturday and **9:00 to 5:00** on the Sunday. This course covers rescue techniques for all types of craft as well as Safety Boat Handling for Race Management and Coaching. It teaches boat handling skills that would be useful for everybody who drives a Safety Boat for Club events. The cost of this course will also be \$100 with members undertaking a Coaching Course being paid for by the Sailing School.

Learn to Sail Courses:

All of our Learn to Sail Courses, Tackers 1, 2 and 3, Start Sailing 1 & 2 for both Juniors and Adults and the more advanced courses of Better Sailing, Start Racing and Better Racing will be available to start on the weekend of **4th and 5th November**.

It almost certain that the Start Sailing 1 & 2 for both Adults and juniors will continue to be on Saturdays. Both these groups will start at 9:00 with the juniors finishing at 11:30 and the adults finishing at 2:00. The more advanced courses will remain starting at 3:00 with a 6:00 finish. Which advanced courses are run depends on demand at the time.

Days for the Tackers courses may change depending on numbers and Instructors available. Last year we ran Tackers 1 and 3 on Sunday and Tackers 2 on the Saturday. The program has been set up this way, but is possible that either Tackers 1 or 3 could be run on the Saturday. This will be finalised before the start of the season.

Junior and Youth Development Squads:

We are hoping that for this summer we will have several more trained Coaches at the Club. I have already completed the new Coaching Course and we hope to have 4 more people completing the course in October. This should allow us to significantly improve the standard of Coaching that we are offering and also allow us to have at least 3 Coaches available every day. We also hope to have specialised class coaches visit from time to time.

We are proposing to have a BBQ Lunch and launch Day on **Sunday 1st October** with the weekly Coaching Sessions beginning on **Sunday 29th October**. (Most of our Coaches will be doing the Coaching Course on 21st and 22nd October.)

We have included all the Victorian Sailing Cup events in the Sailing Program this year as well as Class Championships where possible. The VS Cup is a series of point scoring events that contribute towards the Sailors making the Victorian Sailing Team. We encourage our sailors to go to these events as a Rye Sailing Team in Minnows, BICs 29ers etc. This is a great way to both improve your sailing and make a heap more friends.

All enrolment forms for courses and other Learn to Sail and Development Squad information on the website will be updated by the end of August. There will be some small increase in costs of some courses but others will remain the same. We hope to see you all back at the club over the coming summer. Child Safe Standards and Working With Children Checks

The **Child Safe Standards** are a set of Policies and Procedures that have been provided for all sporting Clubs in Victoria by the Department of Health and Human Services and promoted to us through VicSport. They essentially set out a process to support good governance in Sporting Clubs to ensure that the environment is one in which children feel safe, respected, valued and encouraged to reach their full potential. Furthermore, the club must be inclusive in offering the same opportunities to children from different ethnic backgrounds including those coming from Aboriginal backgrounds and children with a disability. The standards also set out a procedure to deal with any incident of child abuse and make it clear that acting on any such issue is the responsibility of all members.

The introduction of Child Safe Standards has been mandated for all Sporting Clubs in Victoria and Executive Committee has implemented these as required from the beginning of 2017. We have reviewed our own practices, introduced a Child Safe Policy, we have introduced a Child Safe Incident Report and procedures to follow if a problem arises and appointed 2 Child Safe Contacts who children are encouraged to talk to if they feel unsafe or unhappy at the Club. (Jean and Bob Cooper). We also have added required Child Safe specific behaviours to the Club Codes of Conduct and we will publish these in following Sandbars. We will continue to work on aspects of promoting the Child Safe Procedures over the coming season.

While not part of the Child Safe Standards as such, changes have also been made to the **Working With Children Check** requirements. Essentially, what the changes mean is that if you are rostered to carry out a duty for the club you will need to have a current Working With Children Check unless you are exempt under the WWCC guidelines.

If you have children under 18, who are taking part in Club activities that your duty will support, you may be exempt, although that may also depend on both the duty and the activity that your children are doing. If you want further clarification on this, you can check through the Working With Children website, or ask me for clarification. Grandparents also may be exempt, but other relatives are not. If you have a current Victorian Institute of Teaching registration card, you are exempt.

Working With Children Checks are free if you are working as a volunteer. When you apply, you must specify what organisations you will work for. You apply on line at <http://www.workingwithchildren.vic.gov.au/>. If you have a WWCC from working with another organisation, you will need to add Rye Yacht Club as an organisation that you will work for as a volunteer. (This is a mandatory requirement under the Working With Children Act.)

We are happy to have a computer available at the Club on weekends through September and October if you need some help with your application. Your application can be made on line including verification of identity. You will be sent an email that includes a barcode that you will then need to take to a Post Office to have a photo taken and submitted to complete your application.

The Club is required to keep a copy of WWCCs from its members and this file will be kept in the “fire safe” at the Club to ensure privacy. If you have any further queries about this, please ask me.

The new gate to the Rosebud side has a "Push to Exit" button on the kayak racks as can be seen below. If you push this button you will have 10 seconds to exit the new gate.

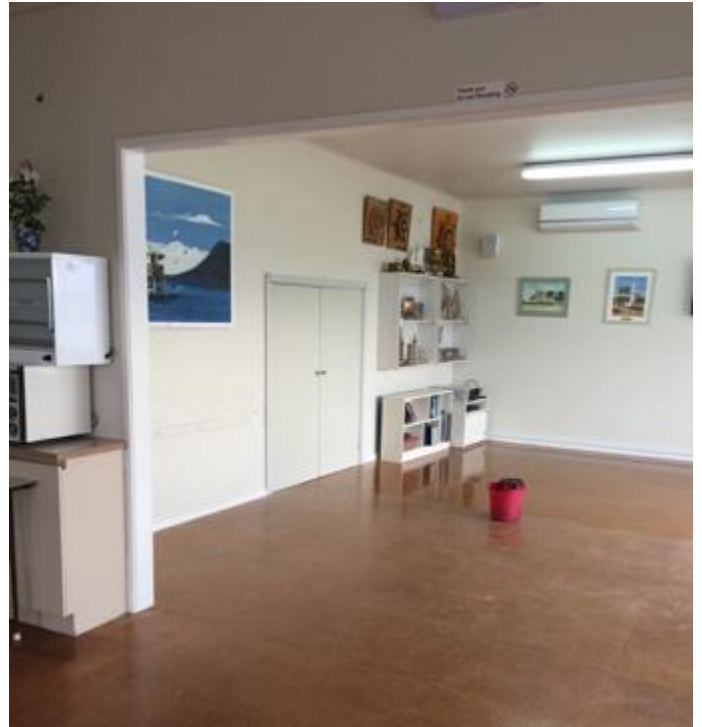


New Chair and Table Storage

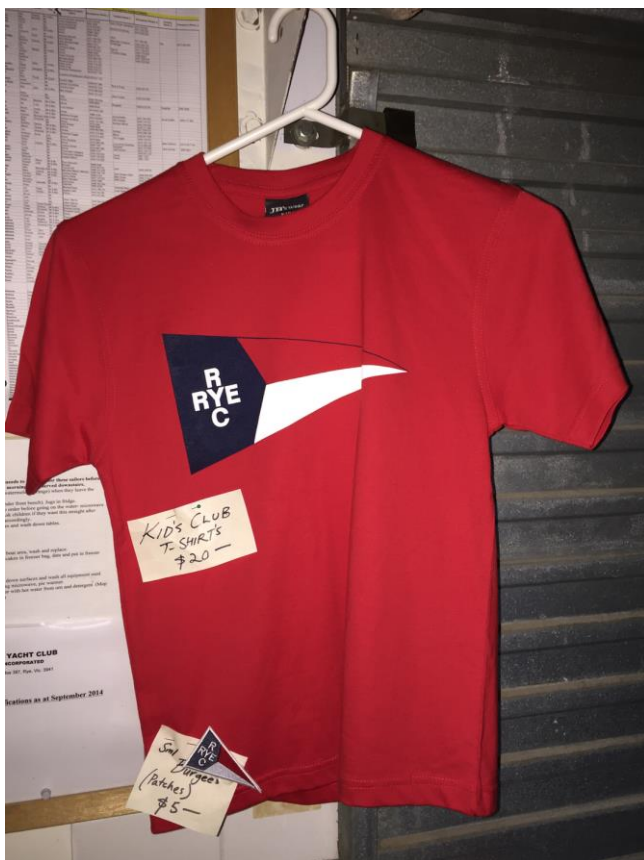

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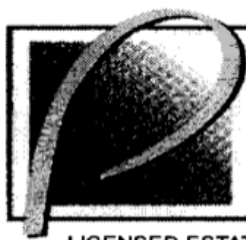
